







Enforcement Authority: Common Law

• The power and authority of the Attorney General in matters involving charitable trusts is deeply rooted in Texas common law.

Coffee v. William Marsh Rice University, 403 S.W.2d 340,343 (Tex. 1966).

The Attorney General's authority and duty to protect the public interest in charity by suing in courts of equity is routinely and uniformly recognized by Texas courts.
