- The right-of-way (ROW) is the paved street and usually about five to ten feet on either side
- The ROW contains the paved portion of the street used for vehicular travel, bicycle lanes, sidewalks, and space for the installation of utilities, including water, sewer, electric, gas, and telecommunications (including cable and internet).
- Development considerations will be based on public health, safety, and welfare concerns and aesthetics.
