


88TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION UPDATE

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2024



HB3 EFFECTIVE 9/1/2023

- Requires the commissioner to adopt facilities standards for new and existing instructional facilities to ensure a safe and secure environment
- Requires school employees to complete a mental health training program on recognizing and supporting children and youth experiencing mental health or substance abuse issues that may pose a threat to school safety
- Requires districts to provide a student's disciplinary record and any threat assessment when the student seeks to enroll in another district
- Requires school districts to have an armed police officer, or a commissioned peace officer, present at every campus during regular school hours but allows them to claim a good cause exception if needed
- Requires districts to notify parents of violent activity that occurred or is being investigated at a campus

HB3 EFFECTIVE 9/1/2023

- Requires schools to establish a clear procedure for a student to report concerning behavior exhibited by another student for threat assessment
- Requires districts to provide maps of all campuses to DPS and local law enforcement agencies
- Makes documents related to school safety facilities requirements confidential and not subject to disclosure under the Public Information Act
- Allows districts to require identification from a person entering any district property
- Sets the school safety allotment at \$10 per student, with a \$1 increase for every \$50 increase in the basic allotment, plus \$15,000 per district campus, and allows funds to be used to secure facilities and employ a school safety director

Model Standards for Parental Notification 04 Which incidents require notification is a local decision based on local needs,

- O1 School districts must adopt a policy related to timely parental notification of violent activity
- O2 Policy must include electronic notification by email and text, an option for real-time notification, and protect student privacy
- **03** Notification should be for incidents that pose a serious or continuing threat to campus

School Safety Facility Standards- 19 TAC 61.1031

- All doors on all buildings must be numbered.
- **02** Requires a main entrance to allow the identification of a person from inside the building, require assistance to enter, and a check-in/check-out location
- **03** All exterior doors must be locked unless actively monitored and constructed of materials that make them resistant to forced entry

04 Facilities must include an exterior master key box, or local law enforcement must have physical master keys
