The meaning of "vessel" is significant throughout maritime law. The Supreme Court apparently settled the issue in *Stewart v. Dutra Co.* (2005), but *Lozman* (2013) now provides a new formulation.

Fifth Circuit Vessel Status Cases Including Barker v. Hercules Offshore, Inc.

The Supreme Court's decisions in Stewart (2005) and Lozman (2013) presage new wrinkles in the Fifth Circuit's vessel-status jurisprudence. Meanwhile, courts in the Fifth continue to crank out decisions addressing the vessel status of new types of offshore oil patch apparatus. The Fifth Circuit's March 2013 decision in Baker is a potentially important related development. Hear a critical analysis of these cases.
