Leading Experts Will Discuss Newly Enacted Legislation from the 81st Texas Legislature

A staggering 966 changes have been proposed to the Family Code. With a new Speaker in the Texas House and bipartisan spirit generally prevailing in the Capitol, it appears the Family Code will be amended in significant ways that will affect the family lawyers' practice. This legislative update is designed to make you aware of the new substantive changes to the Code and how those changes will affect your practice.

- · Repeal of economic contribution and return to equitable reimbursement
- · Corrective legislation for allocation of separate and community interest in employee benefits
- Changes to the Standard Possession Order reflecting a need for clarity and a gradual expansion of possession and access for the non-primary parent
- New qualifications for parenting coordinators and their responsibilities
- Gestational agreements for single parents
- Elimination of the requirement to designate the primary residence of the child
- New provisions for rescission of voluntary acknowledgments of paternity
- Elimination of time periods for challenging paternity
- New provisions for termination of parental rights due to mistaken belief of paternity
- Siblings rights to access for children in DFPS care
- · Rights of deployed military personnel with regard to parenting plan rights
- New protective order provisions relating to teen dating violence
- New child support laws and more revisions to the CPS laws
- Both good and bad bills that did not pass
