Barbara Hines has practiced in the field of Immigration Law since 1975 and is Board Certified by the Texas Board of Legal Specialization in Immigration and Nationality Law. She is currently a clinical professor at The University of Texas School of Law and directs its Immigration Law Clinic. She served as the first Co-Director of the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law of Texas, Immigrant and Refugee Rights Project and is currently of counsel and a member of the Board of Directors of the organization. She has received awards from the national and Texas chapters of the American Immigration Lawyers Association (AILA), and is listed in the Who's Who of American Women and Best Lawyers in America.

Lee Terán is a clinical professor of law and directs the Immigration & Human Rights Clinic at St. Mary's University School of Law. She is a 1975 graduate of the University of Colorado School of Law, and has been Board Certified by the Texas Board of Legal Specialization since 1984. Prior to joining St. Mary's University, she was Co-Director of the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law of Texas, Immigrant and Refugee Rights Project, and was engaged in private practice.

Joseph A. Vail is a 1979 graduate of Widener Law School. He entered the field of immigration law in 1980 as a volunteer through VISTA (Volunteers In Service To America). He was a staff attorney for three years with Gulf Coast Legal Foundation in Houston, and from 1984 to 1995 he was in private practice in Houston. In 1995 he was appointed as an immigration judge with the United States Department of Justice, where he served until 1999. From July 1999 to the present he has supervised the immigration clinic at the University of Houston Law Center where he has also taught several courses on immigration law. He is board certified by the Texas Board of Legal Specialization in Immigration and Nationality Law.
