Fielder attended The University of Texas School of Law where he served as editor-inchief of the *Texas Law Review*. He graduated with the highest standing in his class earning him the honor of teaching law in the company of Deans Leon Green, W. Page Keeton, and Charles Tilford McCormick.

After several years in private practice, Professor Fielder returned to UT Law School in 1961 Portrait artist: A.E.
