


• The Railroad Commission does not have jurisdiction over roads, traffic, noise, odors, leases, pipeline easements or royalty payments

• "...it is well established that the commission does not have jurisdiction to decide disputes over title or rights of possession...Rather, the commission's authority to grant permits is negative in nature – the commission, through a permit, merely removes a barrier the conservations laws would otherwise impose..."
