Nationality Requirements

- The Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, effective August 22, 1996
 - Placed limitations on an immigrant's eligibility for Medicaid benefits
 - Limited either eligibility or placed time limits on the receipt of benefits
- Medicaid rules and federal rules refer to immigrants as "aliens"

Nationality Requirement: General Rule

- Must either be a citizen or national of the United States
- Alien who entered prior to August 22, 1996, lived continuously since entry, and is a qualified alien
- Alien who entered on or after August 22, 1996, lived continuously since entry, is a qualified alien and meets certain eligibility limitations

General Rule, cont...

- An “alien” is a non-U.S. citizen or national
- Aliens are categorized as either qualified or non-qualified aliens
- Categorization is based on immigration classification and date of entry into the U.S.
