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Why a Conversation about a Code of Ethics?

- -To acknowledge to each other what we believe is ethical conduct
- -To tell others (the public) what we believe in
- -To be clear with each other about our expectations regarding ethical conduct
- -Because all professionals should have a moral code

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Texas Educators' Code of Ethics

Located in Chapter 19 of the Texas Administrative Code, Rule § 247.1 and § 247.2. Section 247.1 outlines the ethics code's purpose and scope, including applicable definitions, while Section 247.2 details the actual ethical standards that make up the Code.

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Section 247.1(b) provides the following prescriptive directives applicable to Texas educators and their conduct:

- -The Texas educator shall comply with standard practices and ethical conduct toward students, professional colleagues, school officials, parents, and members of the community and shall safeguard academic freedom.
- -The Texas educator, in maintaining the dignity of the profession, shall respect and obey the law, demonstrate personal integrity, and exemplify honesty and good moral character.

- -The Texas educator, in exemplifying ethical relations with colleagues, shall extend just and equitable treatment to all members of the profession.
- -The Texas educator, in accepting a position of public trust, shall measure success by the progress of each student toward realization of his or her potential as an effective citizen.
- -The Texas educator, in fulfilling responsibilities in the community, shall cooperate with parents and others to improve the public schools of the community.
