A TEXAS-SIZED PROBLEM

In Texas, sexually based offenses are considered especially heinous.

686

Texas teachers lost their teaching license following allegations of improper conduct with a student (jan. 2010-Dec. 2016).

About half were charged with crime.



Most common charge was felony for "improper relationship with teacher and student."

Surrendered their license instead of facing disciplinary proceedings.





Of the available data on gender, 57% of accused teachers were men.

Of the available data on age, 79% of accused teachers were under 40.



Reporting Requirements
