



Court of Criminal Appeals Case Law Update







- Kelvin O'Brien and three others planned jewelry heist
 - Stole four million in gold
 - Melted gold and sold it
- Engaging in Organized Criminal Activity by commission
 - Theft
 - Money laundering
- Jury charge treated predicate offenses as manner and means

O'Brien v. State, May 2, 2018

Does the jury have to be unanimous about predicate offenses?

- CCA says no 5 to 4
- Two step analysis
 - What is gravamen of offense?
 - Lack of unanimity violate due process?
- Gravamen is circumstance of conduct
 - "one or more of the following"
- Predicate offenses are "morally and conceptually equivalent"
