CROSS AND DEPOSITION

• Requires successfully knowing how to take a good deposition and conduct a good cross examination

WHEN IS A QUESTION NOT A QUESTION?

- In cross examination we are NOT looking for information—we are PRESENTING IT
- Organizing and presenting information we already know to a fact finder
- We are not asking a QUESTION
- Deposition we are acquiring information
- High school mascot

YOUR CROSS CAN ONLY BE AS GOOD AS YOUR DEPOSITION
