

Grant Agreement Types

• Public charity

- Public charity equivalent with an equivalency determination
- Fiscal sponsors
- Most supporting organizations
- Some government agencies/instrumentalities



Public Charity Grant Agreement

 Written grant agreement not required by law, <u>but</u> strongly recommended





- "Good to have" provisions
 - Public recognition/promotion
 - Anti-terrorism/sanctions
 - Confirmation of discretion and control
 - $\circ\,\text{No}$ earmarking
 - $_{\odot}\,\text{Special}$ language for fiscal sponsors
 - Venue, governing law
