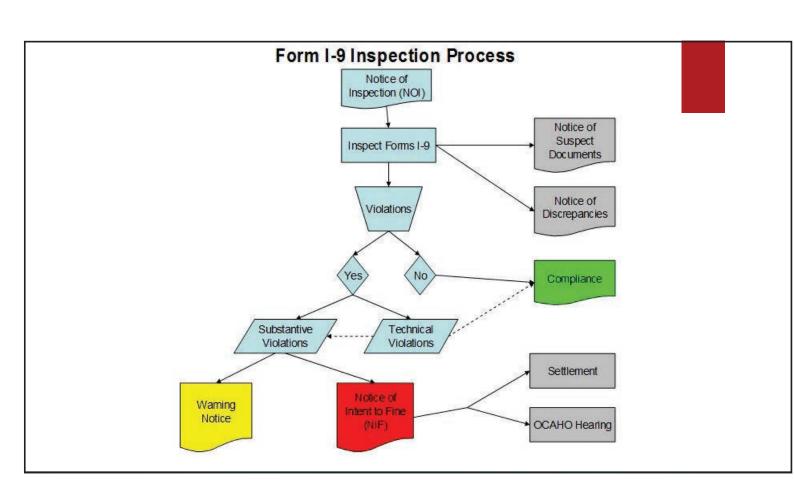

- ► IC E initiated more than 5,000 audits from January to July 2018
- ► Raids and arrests resulting from a udits have also increased
- ► ICE has become creative to get the maximum amount of fines from employers
- ► A signed settlement agreement is not the end of the mad

### **AUDIIS AND FINES**

- ► IC E still targeting certain industries
- ►ICE mainly utilizes tips as a source of determining which companies to audit
- Due to increased numbers of audits, time between each step of the process continues to increase—some audits are taking wellovera year to complete



#### RINE **CALCULATION**

- Divide # of violations by # of employees for which a Form 19 should have been prepared to obtain a vio la tion percentage.
- Fine derived from adding together the Knowing Hire / Continuing to Employ Fine with the Substantive / Uncomected Technical Vio la tions Fine (plus enhancement or mitigation).
- ▶ Typic ally, the date of the vio la tion is the date ICE initiated the audit and not when the I9 wascompleted
