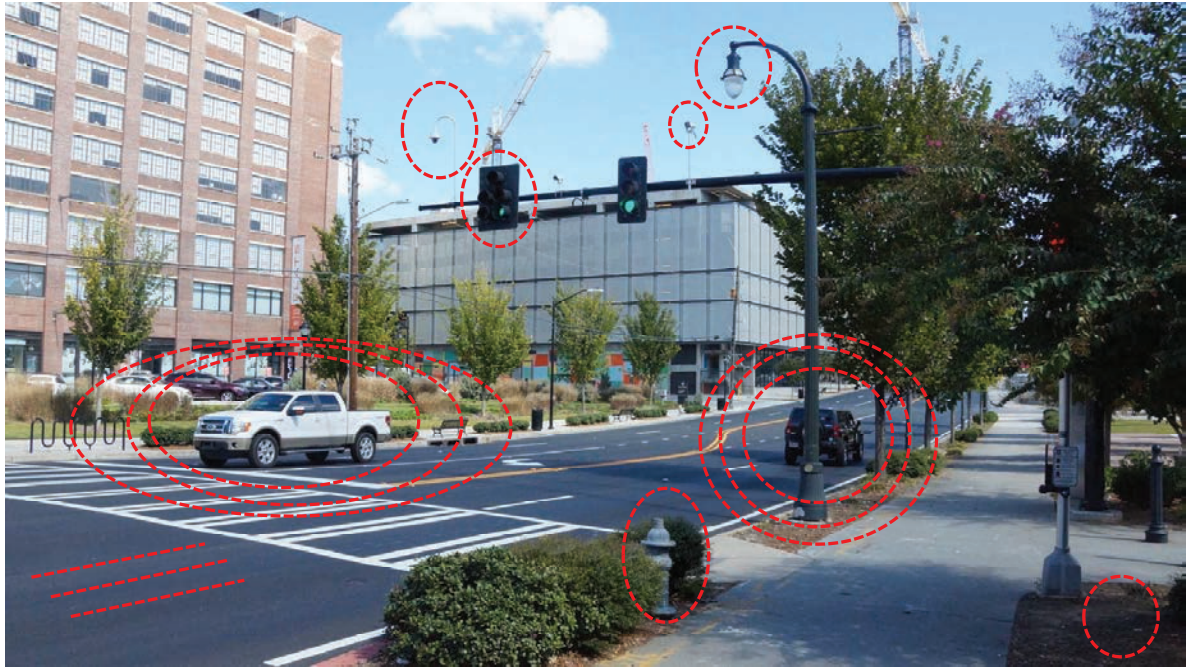
What is a Smart City?
