Rule 1.06(a): Opposing Parties in Litigation

Texas Rule 1.06: Conflict of Interest

"(a) A lawyer shall not represent opposing parties to the same litigation."

Comment 2 to Rule 1.06:

"The term 'opposing parties' means a judgment favorable to one of the parties will directly impact unfavorably upon the other party."

Basic Rules: Conflicts of Interest

Rule 1.06(b): Non-litigation situations

Texas Rule 1.06(b)(1) <u>permits</u> multiple party representation unless

- representation of one client <u>reasonably appears</u> to be or become
- <u>adversely limited</u> by responsibility to another client or the lawyer's own interest.

"Conflicts of interest in contexts other than litigation sometimes may be difficult to assess. . . . The question is often one of proximity and degree."

Basic Rules: Conflicts of Interest

Rule 1.06(b): Non-litigation situations

2 parts to Rule 1.06(b):

- The <u>substantially related</u> matter prohibition of Rule 1.06(b)(1).
- Prohibition of representation of a client if the representation "<u>reasonably appears</u> to be" <u>adversely</u> <u>limited</u> by the lawyer's responsibilities "to another client" or lawyer's interests. Rule 1.06(b)(2).
