beneficiary under 65 seeking benefits

Someone already on benefits

- Inheritance or other benefit
- Personal injury recovery

What Benefits Does the Beneficiary Receive?

- MedicaidOver 40 Medicaid programs in Texas
- oFood stamps (SNAP)
- **OHUD** housing
- OMental health benefits

Self-Settled Trusts and Court-Created SNTs Third-Party Settled Trusts

Self-Settled and Court-Created SNTs

Beneficary's own funds

Beneficary cannot be the trustee

Doesn't matter that beneficiary may not have ever actually possessed funds, so long as he was legally entitled to them (i.e. inheritance or personal injury recovery)
