


BEAST OF BURDEN

MOTION TO LIFT THE AUTOMATIC STAY

- 11 U.S.C. § 362(g)
- "In any hearing under subsection (d) or (e) of this section concerning relief from the stay of any act under subsection (a) of this section—
 - (1) the party requesting such relief has the burden of proof on the issue of the debtor's equity in property; and
 - (2) the party opposing such relief has the burden of proof on all other issues."
