HOW MANY LAWYERS DOES IT TAKE TO READ AN EMAIL?

- Court sends notice to lawyer.
- It goes to lawyer's spam folder.
- Deadline to appeal passes.
- Lawyer blames computer.
- Court doesn't forgive lawyer.
- Client probably doesn't, either.

HOW MANY LAWYERS DOES IT TAKE TO READ AN EMAIL?

- Lawyers for defendant lose \$27.5m judgment.
- Those lawyers file (a) post-judgment motion for JMOL and new trial and (b) motion to seal certain trial exhibits.
- Those lawyers receive email with link via CM/ECF which looks like it is an order relating to the sealing motion.
- But... in fact the linked order had denied defendant's post-judgment motion.
- 28 days later, defendant's deadline to appeal expired.
- Two months later, lawyers realize what happened, argue the 28 days should be extended due to judge's mistake.
 - In course of opposing motion, plaintiff shows 18 lawyers and paralegals had billed time to the defendant for reading the order.
 - Motion to extend time denied.
- Lawyers then paid \$40 million to their former client to settle.
