## **TDRCP Rule 1.05(b) Confidentiality of Information**

**Except as otherwise permitted in this  
rule, “a lawyer shall not knowingly:  
(1) Reveal confidential information of  
a client or a former client. . . .”**

**Rule 1.14(a) Tex. Disc. R. Prof. Cond.:**

***[C]lient property shall be . . . appropriately safeguarded.***
