


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
General Indemnity Structure Issues

Drilling Contract is a Key Driver

- Essential contract for Operator
- Likely a broad reciprocal indemnity
 - Drilling contractor will want indemnity for
 Operator's people and property <u>and people</u>
 and property of Operator's other contractors
- With broad reciprocal in drilling contract,
 Operator will owe indemnity to drilling
 contractor every time there is an accident
