

Start Witness Preparation Early

- Witness preparation can take a significant amount of time
- ➤ Don't neglect the human factors fear, nervousness, guilt, second-guessing
- Listen carefully new information may change your case strategy
- >Keep your ultimate themes in mind

Preparation Techniques

- > Familiarize Witness with the Process
 - > Level of witness experience
 - Don't forget the details
- ➤ Help the Witness Tell His/Her Story
- ➤ Break Story Down into Manageable Sections
 - > Introduction
 - > Affiliation with suit
 - Action taken
 - ➤ Make story accessible

Preparation Techniques (Continued)

- Cross-Examination & Questioning
 - ➤ Set expectations
 - ➤ Simulate opposing counsel's questioning
- >Key Documentary Evidence
 - ➤ Review with witness
 - Related lines of questioning
 - ➤ Don't forget foundation
