
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"What Are the Odds?" Texas Supreme Court Docket Update 2020

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
I. SCOPE


II. OVERVIEW OF DOCKET

A. Opinions

In the term ended August 31, 2019, the Court issued 86 deciding opinions. In the current term, as of May 31, 2020, the Court has issued 82 deciding opinions. 14 other cases had, as of May 31, 2020, been heard at oral argument but not yet decided.



Of the 86 deciding opinions issued in the term ended August 31, 2019, 15 opinions, or 18%, were per curiam opinions. In the current term, as of May 31, 2020, the Court has issued 28 per curiams.



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
