POSSIBLE CRISIS EVENTS

- Types of crises covered by the plan could include:
 - Consumer/environmental advocacy group attacks
 - Consumer injuries/fatalities
 - Criminal allegations
 - Cybersecurity breaches or data theft
 - Employee injuries/fatalities
 - Executive/employee misbehavior
 - Financial difficulties
 - Government investigations (ongoing or concluded with sanctions)
 - Leadership departures and changes
 - Man-made or natural disasters
 - Media investigations
 - Litigation (actual or threatened)
 - Product deficiencies/recalls
 - Social media slip-ups
 - Whistleblower allegations
