Water Transfer to the PUCT





Water Utility Transfer

- Transfer effective September 1, 2014
- Transferred 268 open dockets
- Over 300 new dockets filed
 - 2/3 are CCN related
 - 37 new SERs
- Transferred 20 FTEs –
 - Only 13 employees transferred (9 staff, 4 legal)
- Received an additional 12 FTEs contemplated in the fiscal note to HB 1600/SB 567 in PUC's 2015 Legislative Appropriation Request (LAR).



Water Utility Transfer

- Docket 42861
 - PUCT rules apply
 - *In the Matter of the Application from the City of Georgetown, Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12369, to Acquire Facilities and Transfer and Cancel CCN No. 11590 Held by Chisholm Trail Special Utility District in Bell, Burnet, and Williamson Counties, Texas, Docket 42861, Order on Appeal of Order No. 8 (April 30, 2015).*
 - Informal policies of the TCEQ do not apply
