Supported Decision-Making Act

- Effective Sept. 1, 2015
- Chapter 1357 Texas Estates Code
- Less restrictive alternative to guardianship
- Part of guardianship reform

Supported Decision-Making

- Process to support adult with intellectual, developmental or cognitive disabilities
- Provides help so adult can make own life decisions:
 - Where to live and with whom
 - Services and medical care to receive
 - Where to work

Supported Decision-Making Agreement

- Written agreement
- Allows adult with a disability to choose "supporter"
- Supporter helps adult:
 - Obtain information needed to make decision
 - Understand the choices, risks
 - Communicate choice to appropriate parties
- Supporter does NOT make decision
