- REPIL bills are introduced with proposals that have received State Bar Board of Directors' approval.
- Once introduced, they're no longer "REPIL bills."
- REPIL bills end up with provisions that we re not originally REPIL proposals.
- Non-REPIL provisions added to REPIL bills are noted in the paper. In this presentation, they are highlighted in bumt orange.



Speaking of Disclaimers....

- The Te xas Uniform Disc la imer of Property Interests Act.
- New Property Code Ch. 240. (Sorry.)
- The re's no 9-month dead line for disc laimers for state law purposes.
 - De-coupled from tax law.
 - Focus on acceptance, not the calendar. If property is accepted, it cannot be disclaimed.
