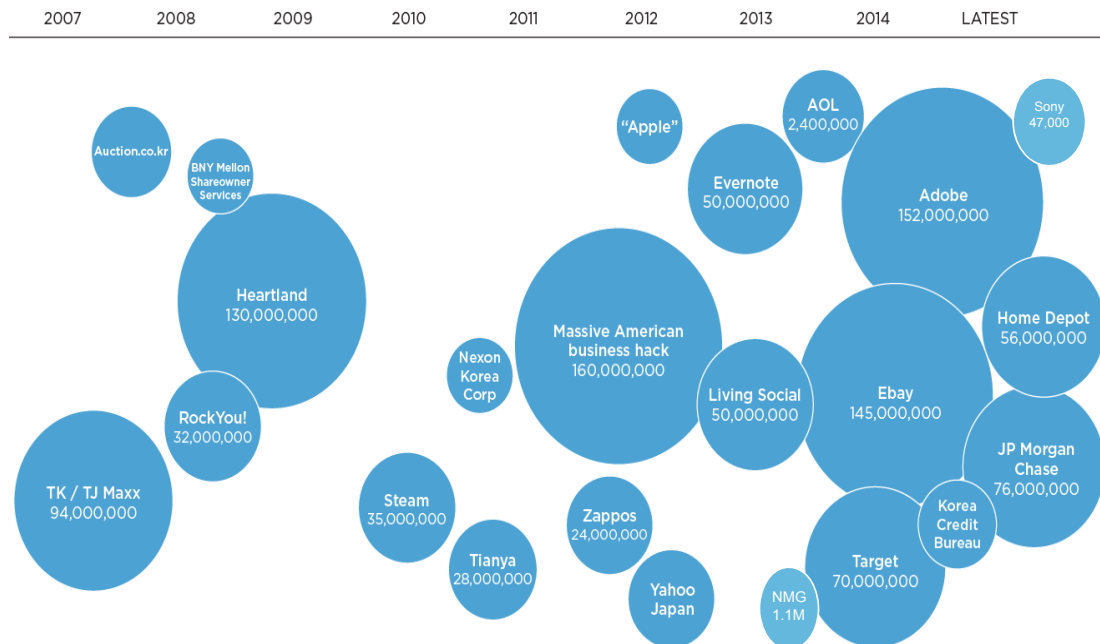

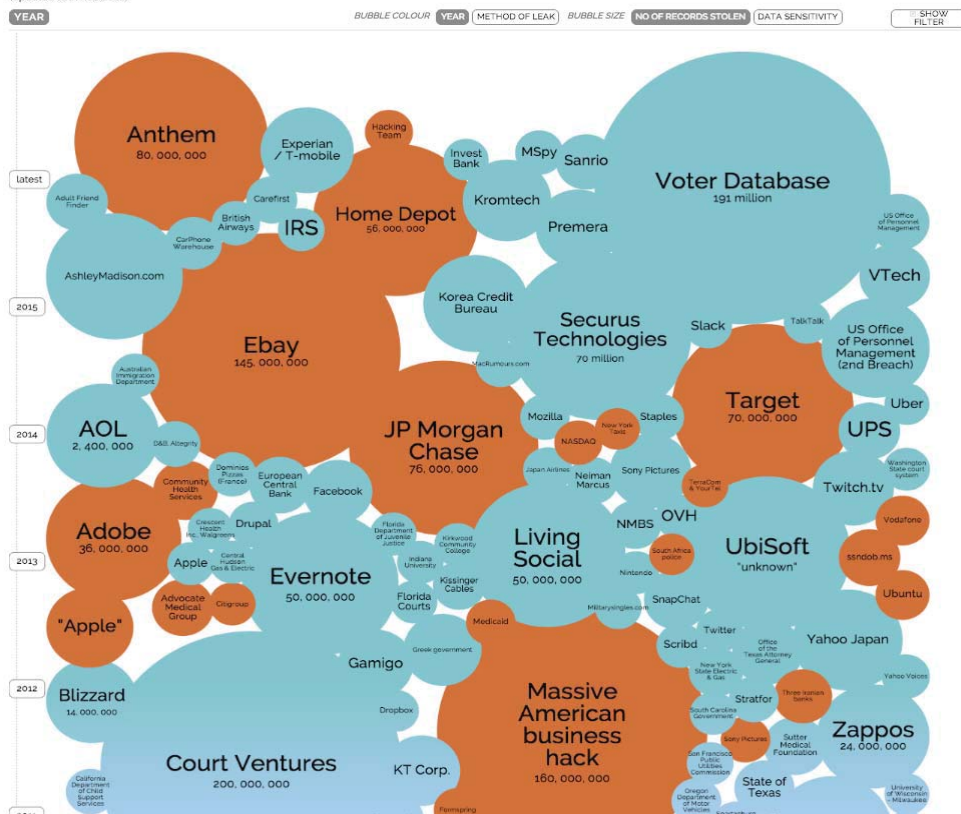
Before 2014

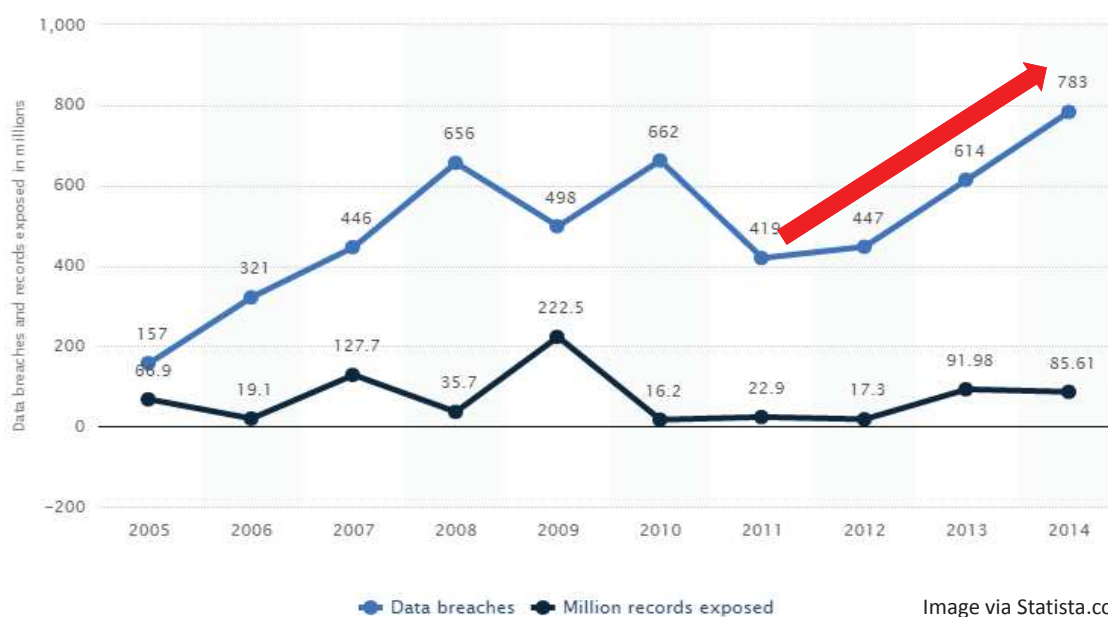
