# How often do they affect disposition of a case?

### Judicial Survey 2015

Rarely: 65%

Sometimes: 33%

Never: 2%




Start Early

#### **Before Submission**

Identify incomplete arguments and responses:

- Incorporate critical omissions into argument
- Use oral argument exhibits as a substitute for a post-submission brief



**Before Submission** 

Address new authority in a pre-submission filing if it is:

- Compelling or persuasive
- Noncumulative
- Substantive

### **Before Submission**

Take steps to preserve the argument:

- Check to see if audio/video available from court
- Have someone attend argument to transcribe questions
