### S.B. 1267

- Three Broad Goals:
  - 1. Requiring more meaningful notice of facts triggering administrative proceedings
  - 2. Creating judicial remedy for a licensee whose license has been suspended without notice
  - 3. Removing procedural traps in the motions for rehearing process to avoid loss of jurisdiction based on technicalities

# S.B. 1267 — Notice Issues

- Section 2001.052
  - General Notice Requirements for All Cases
  - Judicial weakening of Subdivision (a)(4)
- Section 2001.054
  - Additional Notice Requirements for Licensees
  - Judicial Destruction of Subdivision (c)(2)
  - SCOTX: ". . . indistinguishable from the general notice requirements under section 2001.052."
- No recourse for summary suspension limbo

### S.B. 1267 — Action on Notice Issues

- Section 2001.052(a):
  - (4) a short, plain statement of the <u>factual</u> matters asserted.
- Section 2001.052(b):
  - More detailed statement required seven days before hearing, instead of three
  - State agencies required to assert all statutes or rules not previously noticed at least seven days before hearing, or else seven-day continuance on request

## S.B. 1267 — Action on Notice Issues

- Section 2001.052(c):
  - Added Subsection (c) makes state agency's failure to follow (a)(3) or (b) constitute prejudice to substantial rights of appellant
  - Exceptions:
    - Waiver
    - Court finding of no unfair surprise and prejudice
