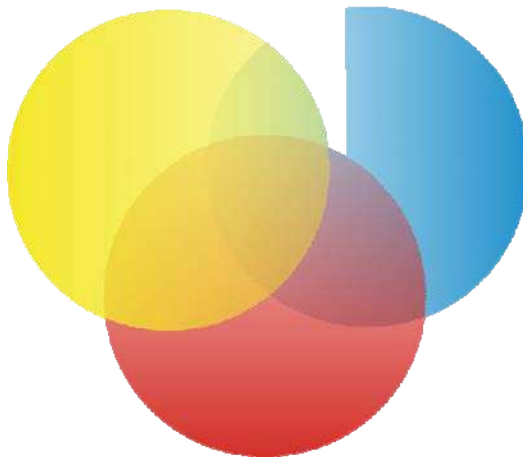

- The acceptance of a practice by one branch of government that implicates the role of another branch

Types of Acquiescence

- By agreement
- By waiver

- To the judicial branch*
- To the executive branch
