Why Lawyers Lose Their Licenses

- o 1. Criminal and amoral behavior
- o 2. Impaired Lawyers
 - Center for Professional & Ethics stated that 20% of lawyers will be impaired at some point in their practice
 - 12% of all attorneys are suffering from clinical depression
- o 3. Newly licensed lawyers without tools
 - o Geta mentor
 - Money screws with your ethics; large student debt
