#### Public Charity Lobbying Limits: Two Alternative Tests

- "No Substantial Part" Test: No substantial part of a charity's activities may be lobbying
  - This is the default test
- 501(h) Expenditure Test...



#### 501(h) Expenditure Test

- · Clear dollar-based limits
  - Overall limit: 20% of first \$500K
     expenditures, then lesser percentages
  - Grassroots limit: 25% of overall limit
  - Maximum lobbying: \$1 million (\$250,000 grassroots)
- Clear definitions of lobbying...



## What is Lobbying?

Direct Lobbying	<b>Grassroots Lobbying</b>
Communication	Communication
Expressing a View	Expressing a View
Specific Legislation	Specific Legislation
Legislator (or other official or staffer involved in legislation)	General Public (Not "members")
Although not allowed to lobby	Call to Action

Although not allowed to lobby themselves, private foundations may also use these rules to determine whether an activity falls outside of the definition of "lobbying," making it a permissible foundation activity

## Key Point: Specific Legislation

More than just legislation that has been introduced...

- A bill
- Proposed legislation (e.g. model bills)
- · Draft amendments
- · Specific legislative policy proposals
- Congressional resolutions
- · Treaties requiring Senate ratification
- · Ballot measures
