#### The Debate on Activism

- Has the growth of activism resulted in public companies becoming too "short-term" oriented?
- Do activists incentivize companies to focus on short-term results at the expense of long-term growth?
- Can an activist agenda that boosts short-term value be consistent with long-term growth?
- How should investors choose between short-term returns and long-term growth?
- Should long-term shareholders have more voting rights than short-term shareholders?

### Is Activism Beneficial or Detrimental to the Economy?

#### **Critics of Shareholder Activists Say:**

- Shareholder activism harms companies and the U.S. economy by forcing companies to focus on actions that create a short-term increase in the company's stock price at the expense of long-term growth
- "Typical" activist "playbook" and response to activists leads to the following:
  - reduced capital expenditures, R&D budgets, employee training and wages
  - Decline in long-term innovation and competitiveness
  - For the primary purpose of returning capital to shareholders through dividends and buybacks
