




Questions Posed

Arguments for Abatement

- 1. Fifth Amendment will unfairly impede defense.
- 2. Critical evidence in criminal case unavailable to civil litigants.



Arguments Against Abatement

- 1. Abatement = blanket assertion of 5th.
- 2. Parties entitled to full discovery within reasonable time.
- 3. "Memories will likely dim and evidence become unavailable."
