



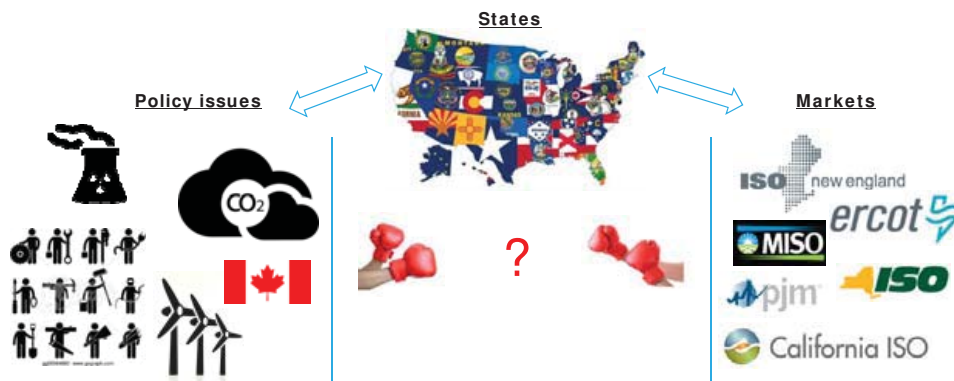

Framing the Core Issues



State policies increasingly collide with competitive markets.
Can we square the circle to implement competitive markets
that achieve the desired low-carbon future?

From the state perspective: Are markets a barrier to
mandated/desired state policies?



States Have Multiple Objectives

- ✓ ...which are not always reflected in, or consistent with, centralized competitive markets:
- ✓ NJ LCAPP and Maryland – control over capacity decisions and reliability; skepticism of market ability and outcomes
- ✓ CT Contracts – open hostility to ‘federally-mandated congestion costs’
- ✓ Ohio, Illinois, NY – jobs, taxes, votes
- ✓ MA – off-shore wind industry; Global Warming Solutions Act goals



Current Challenge: ZECs

State	Program Overview	Status
NY	<ul style="list-style-type: none">As a part of the Clean Energy Standard, NY has granted \$7.6 billion in subsidies in the form of ZEC payment to three economically challenged EXC nuclear units in upstate NY: Nine Mile, Fitzpatrick & Ginna.ZECs will be paid over 12 years from 2017 to 2029 with price adjustments every two years.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Complaint filed in a Federal District Court in NY on October 19, 2016.On July 25th 2017, the court granted Defendants' and Intervenor's motions to dismiss.Appeal filed Aug 24, 2017.
IL	<ul style="list-style-type: none">IL passed the Future Energy Jobs Act (FEJA), which included a \$253 million/yr ZEC payment over 10 years to in-state nuclear units.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Complaint filed in a Federal District in IL on February 14, 2017On July 14th 2017, the court granted the motions of Defendants and Intervenor Exelon to dismiss and denied Plaintiffs' motion for a preliminary injunction.Appeal was filed on July 17, 2017

Other States have contemplated nuclear subsidies (CT, OH, PA, NJ).

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
