





- ✓ ... which are not always reflected in, or consistent with, centralized competitive markets:
- ✓ NJ LCAPP and Maryland control over capacity decisions and reliability; skepticism of market ability and outcomes
- ✓ CT Contracts open hostility to 'federallymandated congestion costs'
- ✓ Ohio, Illinois, NY jobs, taxes, votes
- ✓ MA off-shore wind industry; Global Warming Solutions Act goals

**Program Overview** State Status As a part of the Clean Energy Standard, NY has granted \$7.6 · Complaint filed in a Federal District Court in NY on October billion in subsidies in the form of ZEC payment to three economically challenged EXC nuclear units in upstate NY: On July 25<sup>th</sup> 2017, the court granted Defendants' and Intervenors' motions to dismiss. NY Nine Mile, Fitzpatrick & Ginna, ZECs will be paid over 12 years from 2017 to 2029 with price Appeal filed Aug 24, 2017. adjustments every two years. · Complaint filed in a Federal District in IL on February 14, IL passed the Future Energy Jobs Act (FEJA), which included a \$253 million/yr ZEC payment over 10 years to in-state On July 14<sup>th</sup> 2017, the court granted the motions of Defendants and Intervenor Exelon to dismiss and denied nuclear units. Plaintiffs' motion for a preliminary injunction.
Appeal was filed on July 17, 2017

Other States have contemplated nuclear subsidies (CT, OH, PA, NJ).
