For Victims of Qualifying Crimes

U- VISA REQUIREMENTS

- Vic tim of a qualifying criminal activity
- Hasbeen, is being, or is likely to be helpful in
 - •De te c tion, investigation, prosecution, conviction or sentencing
- Suffe red substantial physical or mental abuse as a result of the victimization
- Po sse sse s information about the crime
- Crime occurred in the U.S. or violated U.S. law
