

## Jevic High Points

## The SCT's Narrow Way

- 86 cases in 36 years (2.4/year)
  - o 3.5% of all civil cases
- 37% of decisions (32/86) are "broad"
  - o 25% (5/20) in close cases (3-4 dissents)
