QUESTION 1

How much input does the Law Clerk have in deciding how the Judge might rule on a case?

Answers:

· A Bunch: 2 Judges; 3 Law Clerks

A Little: 1 Judge

None: 0

Comments—Question 1

- · Judge: Depends on case and ruling
- · Law Clerk: Yes, lots of input; but does not necessarily means lots of influence. The decision is the Judge's 100%. "Law Clerk proposes; Judge disposes"
- · Law Clerk: Judge makes ultimate decision, but asks for recommendations
- Law Clerk: We discuss and develop rulings collaboratively

QUESTION 2

How many times has the Law Clerk privately expressed disagreement with a decision the Judge has actually made?

Answers:

Less than 3 times: 1 Law Clerk
More than 3 times: 2 Judges
Never: 1 Judges; 2 Law Clerks

Comments-Question 2:

- <u>Judge</u>: I respect my Law Clerk when he/she disagrees. And my Law Clerk does not always admit it when he/she disagrees, "but I know better"
- <u>Judge</u>: I encourage my Law Clerk to be candid with me and give me best advice. Many times we agree, but sometimes we do not agree
- · <u>Judge</u>: Never disagree, but we usually discuss cases before ruling
- · Law Clerk: Never disagree outside of Chambers
- Law Clerk: We have open discussions all the time about when Judge is wrong ("ha ha")
- <u>Law Clerk</u>: Sometime we may disagree on the precise result, but we rarely (if ever) disagree on general result

QUESTION 3

Generally, who prepares the first draft of an Opinion?

Answers:

Judge: 1 Judge; 1 Law Clerk (see comments)

• Law Clerk: 2 Judges; 2 Law Clerks

Comments-Question 3:

- Judge: Sometimes Judge prepares draft, sometimes Law Clerk
- · Law Clerk: Judge prepares draft, but not always

QUESTION 4

Does the Judge communicate with the Law Clerk while on the bench during a hearing or trial?

Answers:

- Yes, specify how: *3 Judges; 3 Law Clerks*. All use sametime instant *"chat"* messaging; some frequent, some infrequent
- No: 0
