What Is Planned Giving?

- In essence, any arrangement intended to benefit charity that involves postponement of charity's ability to receive the benefit and (in all likelihood) is subject to a variety of contingencies.
- The term "planned giving" is used to cover an array of structures:
 - Non-binding statement of intention to make a gift or bequest
 - Revocable designation of plan assets or life insurance
 - Charitable pledge meant to bind the donor or his/her estate

What Is Planned Giving?

- Remainder interest in the donor's residence or farm
- Participation in a pooled income fund
- Charitable gift annuity
- A charitable remainder trust
- A charitable lead trust

What Regulatory Areas Are Relevant?

- State charitable solicitations laws
- State insurance laws (charitable gift annuity programs)
- Federal tax law
- U.S. Philanthropy Protection Act of 1995
