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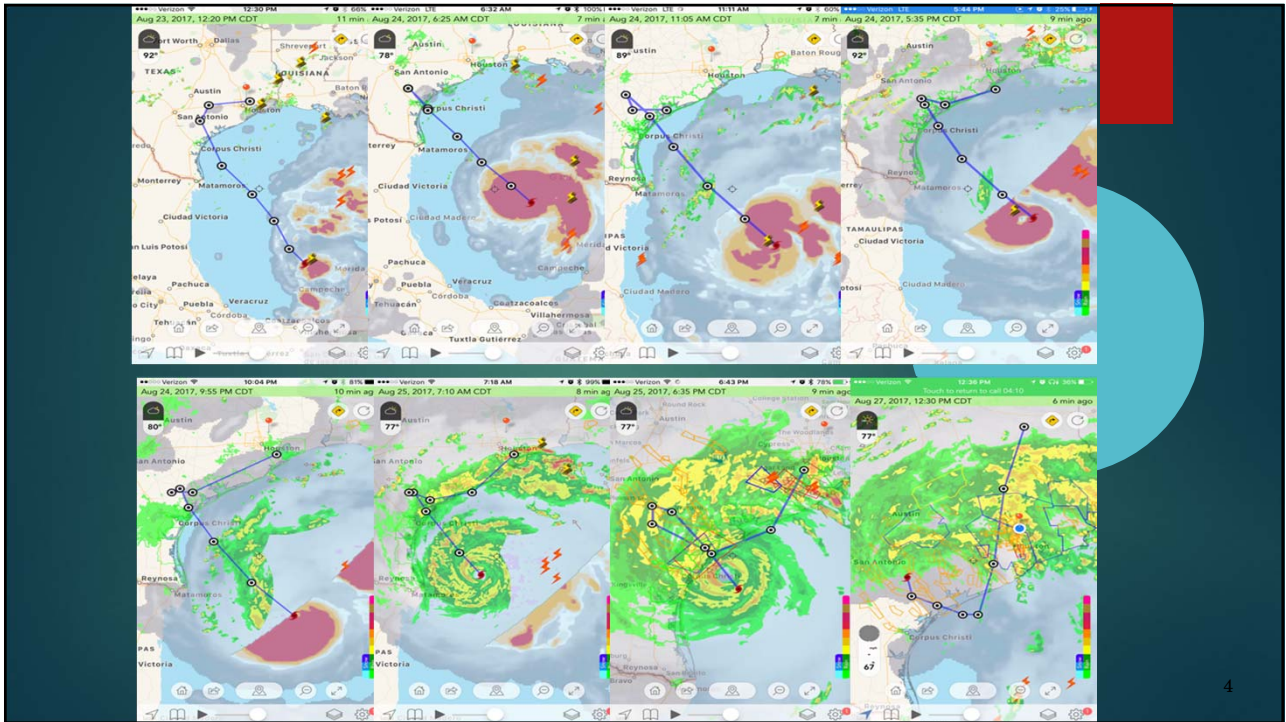
School District Mission

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When you know the worst is coming

Taking care of your people first

Plans to close facilities early is possible

Correspond with local officials and emergency management offices

Have a plan of attack for key administrators and essential personnel

Emergency readiness kits

Emergency response ID badges

Review insurance requirements

During the Disaster

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- ▶ Correspondence with your staff
 - ▶ Central Meeting Locations
 - ▶ Satellite Phones, internet, power issues
- ▶ Corresponding with your Board
 - ▶ Emergency updates, meetings, need to know
 - ▶ Resolution, suspension of policy, ratification of administration's actions
- ▶ Facilities Use
 - ▶ Emergency Shelters
 - ▶ Food Service
 - ▶ Agreements with outside agencies, law enforcement, FEMA, National Guard, Task Force 1, DPS, etc
 - ▶ Donations
