




Question #1: Hostile Work Environment

• Plaintiff is a 30 year-old female and was hired the Executive Assistant to the President of a small bank with 45 employees (President is a married male in his 50s). Plaintiff was hired in January of 2017 and says that the President began constantly touching and rubbing against her almost immediately after her employment began.

Question #1: Hostile Work Environment

• Plaintiff says that at least every week the President would touch or rubup against her (including her breasts or behind) or summon her to the vault or some other place where he engaged in unwelcome sexual talk. Plaintiff reports that he constantly tried to talk to her about sexual topics, including asking if she was dating anyone, how she felt about sex with an older man, and what sexual positions she preferred. Plaintiff said that she was touched, rubbed or pinched every week, even after asking the president to stop.
