The Plaintiff's case should be a rush to disclosure.

Setting Depositions

1. Who do you want to depose?
2. Send a deposition request letter.
3. Send a second deposition request letter.
4. Send a third deposition request letter.
5. Issue a notice.

Get the Notice and *Duces Tecum* Correct

- Is this individual or corporate capacity?
- Be specific in the *duces tecum*.
- Timely serve the *duces tecum*.
- For organization representatives, narrowly and specifically identify areas to be covered.
- Can you compel attendance?
- State in notice that deposition may be videotaped.
