

Judicial Bonds

- Courts with Probate & Guardianship Jurisdiction:
 - Population 125,000 or less: \$100,000 Bond
 - Population 125,000 or more: \$250,000 Bond
 - Statutory Probate Courts: \$500,000 Bond
- Conditioned that Judge will perform duties required by Estates Code.
- Payable on losses caused by Gross Negligence of Judge
- County may opt for insurance instead.
