Four Phases of Crisis Response

- Prevention/ Mitigation
 - Ongoing identification of vulnerabilities/ threats
 - Actions designed to reduce probability of a crisis
 - Actions designed to mitigate the negative impacts of a crisis
- Preparedness
 - Crisis Response Team
 - Training
 - Resources
- Response
 - Actions that address the immediate event
 - Actions designed to reduce the probability of secondary damage
- Recovery
 - Short and long-term Activities focused on remediation and addressing the impact of the crisis
