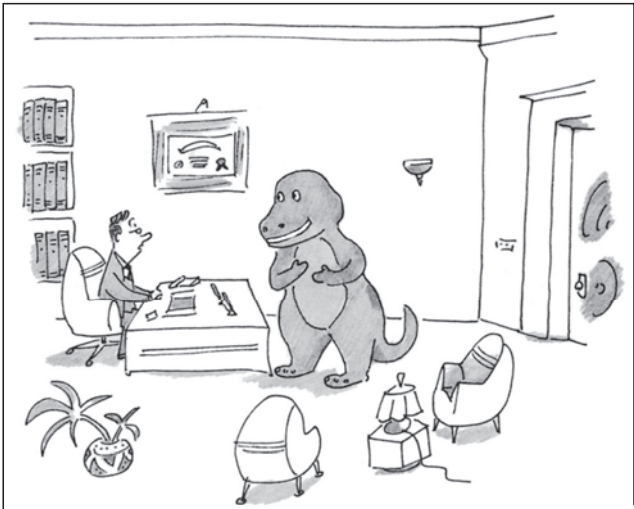

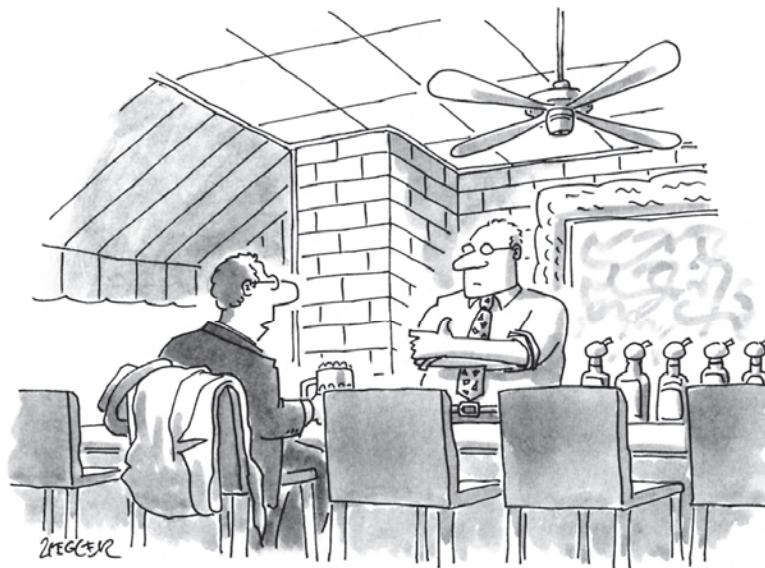
Terminology

- Standard – Technical standard that ensures compatibility and interoperability of devices manufactured by different companies
- Standard Essential Patents (“SEPs”) – Patents that must be practiced in order to implement a standard
 - Whether optional or alternative features in standards are SEPs depends on definitions in standards as well as interpretation during litigation
- FRAND – Fair reasonable and non discriminatory licensing terms

Terminology

- Declared Standard Essential Patents – Patents that were submitted to a standard-setting organization as standard essential
- Alleged Standard Essential Patents – Plaintiff alleges the patent must be practiced in order to use a standard
