Background: What and Why

- Direct infringement involving multiple actors
 - “Divided infringement is where a single act of direct patent infringement occurs through the combined action of two [or more] separate parties.”

RealSource, Inc. v. Best Buy Co.,
514 F. Supp. 2d 951 (W.D. Tex. 2007).
- Method claims, system claims
