

# When to think about attorney's fee\$?

- Early & often
- > Affect settlement value/potential of case
- ➤ Can be substantial
- Some times to think about **requesting** them:
  - ➤ Pleadings—if not plead, recovery may be barred
  - ► Early dismissal practices—different procedures
  - Expert designation—if not, may be precluded
  - Summary Judgment—how's your proof?
  - ➤ Trial—who is your witness?
